Associate in Arts Degree (A.A.)

- Is intended primarily for students who plan to transfer to complete a bachelor's degree.
- Includes the 40 credit Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) which fulfills general education courses at all Minnesota State Universities & the U of M; The MnTC &/or AA fulfill general ed. at some private colleges (Augsburg, Bethany, Concordia-St. Paul, St. Mary's, St. Scholastica), the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, and the University of North Dakota.
- Allows students to include **essential** pre-major courses (courses required for major during Freshman/Sophomore year) in AA; students may choose to follow one of the A.A. Emphasis Tracks.
- Is a generalist liberal arts degree with no specific major at IHCC.

NOTE: Students are strongly encouraged to develop an educational plan in consultation with an Inver Hills counselor to assure that degree and transfer pre-major requirements are fulfilled.
